

# November 6 Ballot Issue Information



**Q: Why is Dublin City Schools placing an issue on the November 6th ballot?**

A: The District is out of space and in need of additional schools. Over the past 10 years, more than 2,400 students have been added and more than 3,000 are expected over the next 10 years.

**Q: What will be on the ballot?**

A: The issue will fund 3 new schools, staff for the new schools, upgrades to existing facilities, safety and security upgrades, technology, and equipment. The issue will be a **no new millage bond issue** and permanent improvement levy, combined with a 5.9-mill operating levy.

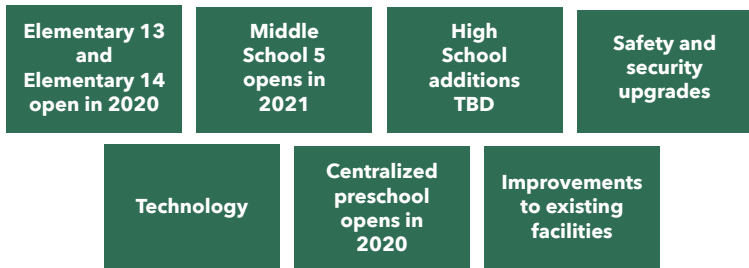
No new millage means new schools and facility improvements will not cost taxpayers anything additional.

**Q: How much will the issue cost taxpayers?**

A: The issue will cost \$207 per \$100,000 of home value, which is the lowest amount requested since 1986.



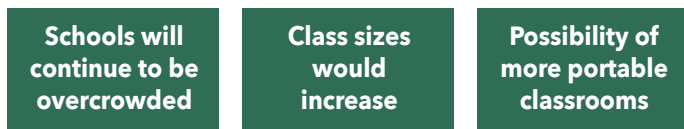
## Q: What happens if the issue passes?



Since the last levy, we have grown by more than 2,000 students, **that's roughly the size of the student body at Coffman High School.**
