The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is an assessment administered to 10th- and 11th-grade students that helps prepare them for the SAT®, college, and careers. Historically, students who take the PSAT/NMSQT score higher on the SAT, on average, than those who don't take the test.



Connect Your Students to Scholarships

Students who take the PSAT/NMSQT in 11th grade typically can compete for recognition and scholarships through the National Merit® Scholarship Program, which honors academically talented students throughout the United States.
