The disposition of thinking like an artist will prepare students to be active participants in an increasingly complex and interconnected world.

#### **EXPERIMENTATION AND CREATIVITY**

- Artists engage with multiple sources to investigate and generate ideas when solving artistic problems.
- Artists confront design challenges and creative problems that help them think in new ways. Students will take more ownership and incorporate these skills into their work as they reach higher levels of mastery.
- Artists develop independence to enable students to identify, strategize and problem solve solutions to artistic problems and meet design challenges.
- Artists explore multiple methods, styles or techniques and use results to guide their artworks.

- Artists explore level appropriate artists and artwork to inform strategies for idea generation.
- Artists work with themes which are personally relevant through knowledge of visual literacy and process of selection.
- Artists demonstrate, apply, expand and choose materials and techniques independently in the creation of artistic products and development of processes.

- Art students will find artists of interest. As they better understand professional artists and their decisions and processes, they will themselves grow as artists.
- Artists learn to integrate history, current culture, and the future to develop a personal philosophy.
- Artists critically analyze the impact of artworks on past and present audiences.

#### PERSISTENCE & TOLERANCE OF AMBIGUITY

- Artists develop through healthy practice habits. Art students set reasonable expectations for growth and monitor progress over time.
- Artists recognize failure as a part of the creative process as they work through roadblocks and challenges to reach an effective resolution.
- Artists persevere through open-ended projects that allow for many possible methods for completion, allowing students to make artistic decisions and encounter choices with many possible solutions. Over time this helps them with "abstract reasoning" and "gray area" decision making. These are skills that serve students in everyday life.

- Artists develop professional techniques and methods through practice, demonstrated through the development of a robust portfolio of art work.
