

K-12 Visual Arts Education Vision

In Dublin City Schools, we believe that visual arts learning is a critical component for all students. K-12 ENDURING UNDERSTANDINGS

PLAY, IMAGINATION, & EXPERIMENTATION

- Artists value demonstrating understanding through various media and experiment with a variety of media when pursuing a project.
- Artists drive their own exploration of new media, seeking out mentors and guidance for technical support.

- Artists see challenges as opportunities for growth.

REFLECTION AND REVISION

- Artists value time, reflection, and revision as necessary aspects of deepening learning.
- Artists develop a mindset for in-depth and evolving exploration of a topic.
- The processes, not only products, of learning and creativity are showcased and discussed in order to deepen learning.

IDEA GENERATION AND CURIOSITY

- Artists use the language of idea generation and development, including conditional language and “what if…” to spark imagination and refine ideas.
- Artists apply critical thinking skills to evaluate their ideas and are flexible in choosing and adapting them.
- Artists understand the value of idea fluency, flexibility, originality, and elaboration to thinking and creativity, and to developing and realizing their vision.

VALUING INFLUENCE AND COLLABORATION

- Artists see one another as “critical friends,” each helping the other to refine ideas and create to the best of their abilities.
- Artists soak up ideas from other people and from the world, and integrate inspiration and feedback in ways that are their own.
- Artists reflect how their ideas have evolved in response to feedback and others’ work, and are encouraged to articulate it.

COMMUNICATION AND CELEBRATION

- Artists communicate ideas, emotions, questions and solutions in a variety of ways.
- Artists make connections between seemingly unrelated ideas and communicate these connections with purpose and intent.
- Artists celebrate the creative process by making their thinking visible to an audience. Making artwork visible to others celebrates the ability of art to inspire change, evoke an emotional response, and form connections.
